Work site: At the contractor's option work will include 36-inch HDPE or 30-inch FPVC gravity pipeline by horizontal directional drilling installation **OR** 48-inch gravity pipeline by Direct Pipe installation method. Work will also include 36-inch gravity pipeline by open trench installation; new utilities and utility relocations including sanitary sewers and storm drains, water mains, power lines, and telecommunications lines; electrical equipment including, wiring, panels, and power distribution; instrumentation and control systems and programming for operation; responsibility of all Seattle Department of Transportation Street Use permit fees, reviews and inspections and other work. The project work is located in the Magnolia neighborhood of Seattle, Washington.

SUMMARY OF WORK

PART 1 GENERAL

1.01 SUMMARY

- A. This Section contains a summary of the work in this Contract, other known work in the vicinity of the Contract work, and other requirements applicable to the Contract.
- B. The work to be performed under this Contract consists of furnishing tools, equipment, materials, supplies, and manufactured articles; furnishing labor, transportation, and services, including fuel, power, water, and essential communications; and performing work or other operations required for the fulfillment of the Contract, in accordance with the Contract Documents. Provide work complete. Provide work, materials, and services not expressly indicated in the Contract Documents that may be necessary for the complete and proper construction of the work and administration of the contract.
- C. The project work is located in the Magnolia neighborhood of Seattle, WA. The purpose of this project is to construct a conveyance pipeline from 32nd Avenue West to 23rd Avenue West.

1.02 WORK OF THIS CONTRACT

- A. Includes:
 - 1. 48-inch gravity pipeline by Direct Pipe installation method.
 - 2. 36-inch gravity pipeline by open trench installation.
 - 3. Modifications to existing diversion structure.
 - 4. New utilities and utility relocations including sanitary sewers and storm drains, water mains, power lines, and telecommunications lines.
 - 5. Electrical equipment including, wiring, panels, and power distribution.
 - 6. Instrumentation and control systems and programming for operation.
 - 7. Responsibility of Seattle Department of Transportation Street Use permit fees, reviews and inspections.
 - 8. And other work as defined in the Contract Documents.
- B. Accomplishment of work in the Contract Documents shall meet requirements of the Contract including timeframes specified by Section 01014.
- C. The above description is not intended to be complete. The work to be completed is provided for in the Contract Documents. The listing per this Section is not intended to relieve the Contractor of the responsibility for reading and understanding the Contract Documents.
- D. Federal, State and Local Laws, Statutes and Regulations are not individually referenced. This provision incorporates by reference the latest version of statutes, laws and regulations. In case of conflict between the requirements of the specifications and requirements of the statutes and regulations, the Contractor shall bring them to the attention of the Project Representative. Lacking a specific response, the more stringent shall control. In no case can this contract be interpreted to override statutes and regulations of governing authorities.
- E. National and industry codes cited, such as IBC, NEC, NFPA, shall include amendments and supplements by the local authority having jurisdiction whether stated or not.

1.03 WORK UNDER OTHER COUNTY CONTRACTS OR BY COUNTY STAFF

- A. The South Magnolia Combined Sewer Overflow Control Project – Storage Facility contract will be under construction during the work of this contract. The project includes the construction of a 1.5 million gallon CSO storage facility on the Port of Seattle West Yard property immediately east of Smith Cove Park.

- B. Cooperate and coordinate with agencies, trades, and contractors involved in the execution of this work as well as work of others not listed but requiring coordination.

1.04 OTHER RELATED CONTRACTS

- A. The Port of Seattle may be constructing the Lift Station No. 7 upgrade project on the Terminal 91 property. Cooperate and coordinate with the Port of Seattle and their contractor during execution of the work of this Contract on the Terminal 91 property.
- B. One or more private utilities may be working in the area prior to, during, and immediately following construction of this Contract. Cooperate and coordinate with all agencies, trades and contractors involved in the execution of these as well as work of others not listed but requiring coordination.
- C. The Existing Diversion Structure receives flows from Pump Station 77, which is owned and operated by Seattle Public Utilities (SPU). Pump Station 77 force main discharges to a bay downstream of the orifice in the Existing Diversion Structure.

1.05 SPECIFICATION LANGUAGE

- A. Specifications are written mostly in imperative and streamlined form. Unless otherwise indicated, this imperative language is directed to the Contractor. Additionally, the words "shall be" shall be included by inference where a colon (:) is used within sentences or phrases.
 - 1. Examples:
 - a. Aggregate: ASTM C33.
 - b. Adhesive: spread with notched trowel.
- B. Related Sections: Individual Specification sections may include a reference to other sections. Specification sections referenced are intended only to assist in identifying associated work and are not intended and shall not be considered to be all inclusive. The Contractor is responsible to perform the work in the Contract Documents whether referenced in the specific specifications or not.
- C. Whenever there is wording stating that an item is "as specified", "as shown", or "as indicated", the reference is to all the Contract Documents. Stating "as specified", "as shown", or "as indicated" does not refer necessarily to a Drawing or Specification, but it refers to either.
- D. The words "Provide" and "Furnish" shall mean supplying, installing, and incorporating into the Work including all labor, materials, supplies and equipment necessary to do so. The word "Supply" shall mean to acquire, deliver, and transfer the item to the County as specified.
- E. Unless otherwise indicated, materials and equipment incorporated into the Work shall be as specified and shall be new and free of defects
- F. Requirements for UL label shall mean UL label or other OSHA/Nationally Recognized Testing Lab [NRTL] agency when approved by Local Authority Having Jurisdiction.

1.06 REFERENCED SPECIFICATION

- A. Whenever a Specification in this Contract references the specifications of WSDOT, City of Seattle or Local Jurisdiction, it is to define the technical standards to be met for this Contract; only the technical standards are referenced. Administrative provisions such as Measurement and Payment of the referenced specification shall not apply to this Contract in any instance.
- B. Whenever a Specification in this Contract references the specifications of the City of Seattle, the term Engineer shall mean the Project Representative.
- C. Whenever a Specification in this Contract references the Seattle City Light Construction Standards, the term Engineer shall mean the Project Representative.

1.07 STANDARDIZED EQUIPMENT

- A. Pursuant to King County Code 4.16, the Wastewater Treatment Division has conducted a process to standardize certain equipment to achieve overall system efficiencies. Equipment designated as 'sole source' or allowing 'no substitutions' or with similar designation have been selected and specified in accordance with this code provision.
